There being a quorum, Chairperson Maila Lourdes G. de Castro called the meeting to order at around 9:00 AM. The RCC then reviewed the proposed agenda and agreed to adopt the same as revised.

1. Review of the Minutes of the Previous Meeting

The RCC reviewed the Minutes of the 135th RCC Meeting held on 10 November 2017 and subsequently approved the same as submitted.

2. Business Arising from Previous Meetings**2.1. Draft RCC Resolution No. 2017-12: *Proposed Amendments to the WESM Rules and WESM Manual of Procedures for Changes to the WESM Rules Issue 2.0***

The Secretariat presented to the RCC minor revisions to the proposed amendments for enhancement as regards the procedure for processing urgent amendments in Section 7.2 of the subject Manual based on the recommendation received from the DOE. The discussion are as follows

- On Section 7.2 a):

The provision now reads:

*"a) Upon receipt of a proposal for an urgent amendment, the Committee Secretariat shall immediately transmit the proposal to the ~~President-Rules Change Committee~~ **Rules Change Committee to assess the proposal, via electronic or similar medium, subject to Section 3.** ~~and-if~~ upon determination that the ~~same proposal~~ constitutes an urgent amendment, the ~~President-Rules Change Committee~~ shall certify as such **giving notice to the President and the proponent.** ~~and immediately direct the Committee Secretariat to convene the Committee."~~*

Atty. De Castro inquired if the RCC has already discussed on the specific procedures in assessing the proposal or if the same will just be part of the RCC's

internal rules. The Secretariat answered that it may just be part of the RCC's internal rules. It was also clarified by the Secretariat that the assessment shall solely be done via electronic or similar medium and that there is no need for the committee to convene.

- On Section 7.2 b) and c):

The provision now reads:

*"b) The Committee shall **convene** within forty eight (48) hours from **the certification of the proposal as urgent amendment** ~~receipt of the proposal~~ ~~convene~~ and render its decision to determine whether the proposal*

~~i) falls within the definition of an urgent amendment set forth in Section 3 hereof;~~

~~ii) satisfies the criteria set forth in Section 4 hereof; and~~

~~iii) has an impact on prices, and/or on the reliability and quality of electricity service, and the nature of the impact.~~

*c) In its ~~evaluation~~ **deliberation**, the Committee ~~may~~ **shall** –*

i) take into account any information and document which it reasonably considers to be relevant for its consideration of the proposal;

ii) consult with persons who are likely to be affected by the proposal; and

iii) seek such information and views from any person with expertise;

iv) in the event of approval of the urgent rules change, the reasons for its adoption;

v) in the event of rejection of proposal for urgent rules change, the reasons for its rejection.

There being no other matters left for discussion, the RCC approved the revisions to the proposal and the draft Resolution for submission to the PEM Board.

Agreements/Action Plans

The RCC approved the revisions to the proposal and the draft Resolution for submission to the PEM Board.
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2.2. Draft RCC Resolution No. 2017-13: *Proposed Amendments to the WESM Manual on Dispute Resolution regarding Mediation and Arbitration Procedures*

The Secretariat presented to the RCC the revised proposal to incorporate the agreement during the previous meeting to specify a timeline within which the Dispute Resolution Administrator should be able to determine whether a Request for Mediation (or Request for Arbitration in certain cases) involves a WESM dispute. The Secretariat also informed the RCC that the revisions have been reviewed and agreed with by the Dispute Resolution Administrator. Said timeline is incorporated in the following provisions in the subject Manual:

- Section 7.1.1:

When a dispute regarding one of the matters described in this Manual arises between and/or among WESM Members including the System Operator and Market Operator, the parties must go through the following steps:

xxx

(d) Should the parties decide to dispense with mediation and, **provided that there has been a determination by the DRA within ninety (90) calendar days from receipt of the dispute that the dispute same is a WESM dispute under Section 2.1(nn) of this Manual**, directly proceed to arbitration, the parties may elect to do so subject to the issuance by the Dispute Resolution Administrator of a certification stating that mediation is no longer a viable option for the parties.

- Section 8.4.3:

Within ninety (90) calendar days from the receipt of the RM, the DRA will assess the RM and determine whether the allegations and issues contained therein are considered a *WESM dispute* under Section 2.1 (nn) of this Manual covered by the dispute resolution procedures under the WESM Rules, taking into account:

96 (a) The type of dispute; and

97 (b) The parties involved.

98 There being no other matters left for discussion, the RCC approved the revisions to the
99 proposal and the draft Resolution for submission to the PEM Board.

On the proposed amendments from the Retail Electricity Suppliers Association (RESA), Ms. Lorreto H. Rivera stated that she still has no updates on whether the same shall be recommended to be removed from the work plan of the RCC. Mr. Isidro E. Cacho Jr., on the other hand, stated that the PEMC Transition Committee tasked the PEMC Corporate Planning and Communications Department (PEMC – CPC) to draft the necessary proposals to the WESM Rules and relevant Market Manuals regarding the framework of participation of Retail Electricity Suppliers in the WESM.

On the proposed amendments regarding Daily Significant Variations Report, Mr. Cacho stated that PEMC is still drafting the said proposed amendments which intends to streamline the reportorial requirements which in some cases are being redundant. He further added that the intent is to merge the Daily Significant Variations Report with the Daily Market Update Report. He then proposed that this proposal be carried-over to the 2018 RCC Work Plan.

On the proposed amendments from the PEM Audit Committee, the Secretariat informed the RCC that it will seek updates from the committee regarding the said proposal.

On the proposed amendments regarding the participation of BESS in the WESM, the Secretariat informed the RCC that PEMC and the Technical Committee are currently working on a proposal regarding the same. Mr. Cacho then suggested to carry-over the activity to the 2018 Work Plan of the RCC.

Preliminary inputs to the 2018 Work Plan were also discussed, as follows:

- Proposals carried over from the 2017 Work Plan (deferred proposals and those not yet submitted by the proponent)
- Proposals remanded by the PEM Board for further study by the RCC and the Market Operator (e.g., regarding MSP Performance Rating, Registration Manual)
- Rules Changes as required by the Transition to Independent Market Operator
- Rules Changes as required by Audit Findings
- Rules Changes as required by the Renewable Energy Market, Renewable Portfolio Standards and Green Energy Option Program
- Rules Changes as required by the Reserve Market
- Rules Changes as required by the Implementation of WESM Mindanao

On the proposals remanded by the PEM Board for further study by the RCC and the Market Operator, Mr. Cacho updated the RCC that PEMC is currently looking into these matters and shall submit its proposal during the first quarter of 2018. Atty. De Castro requested for the Secretariat to include in the draft 2018 RCC Work Plan the reasons of the PEM Board in remanding the proposals.

On the proposed Transition to an Independent Market Operator, Mr. Cacho informed the RCC that there will be a public consultation for the same to be held at the Legend Villas, Mandaluyong City. Upon approval of the transition plan, all PEMC departments involved in Market Operations will be transferred to the Independent Market Operator. Meanwhile, the Market Assessment Group (MAG) and Enforcement and Compliance Office (ECO) shall remain with PEMC. For the WESM Governance Committees, Mr. Cacho stated that the MAG will still be assisting the committees and that there will be no impact on the committees related to the said transition. Mr. Cacho also informed the RCC that there will be rules change proposals related to the following: 1) Transition to IMO; 2) Renewable Energy Market 3) Renewable Portfolio Standards; and 4) Green Energy Option Program. Mr. Ferdinand B. Binondo added that the Secretary of the Department of Energy will be signing a DOE Department Circular for these matters which shall be then translated into rules changes. Noting that the rules changes still have no target timelines, Atty. De Castro recommended to add in the draft work plan, the subject matters of the probable rules changes.

On another note, Mr. Abner B. Tolentino recommended the inclusion of the rules changes related to the Ancillary Services. Mr. Cacho then suggested to just input rules changes for the Reserve Market to cover all related proposals. Mr. Cacho also recommended to include the necessary rules changes for the Implementation of WESM in Mindanao to limit the transactions in Mindanao only since there is still no physical connection of the Mindanao grid to the Luzon and Visayas grids.

The Secretariat informed the RCC that the working draft of the 2018 RCC Work Plan shall be finalized and submitted to the PEM Board on or before March 2018. The RCC noted the information and approved the working draft of the 2018 RCC Work Plan.

4. Other Matters

PEM Board Updates

Dr. Allan C. Nerves (Independent) updated the RCC on the actions of the PEM Board regarding the RCC proposals during its meeting held on 06 December 2017, as follows:

a) Proposed Amendments to the WESM Rules and Various WESM Manuals regarding Metering Standards and Procedures and Metering Point Location

(i) *Regarding back-up meters and audit findings* – approved for endorsement to the DOE, provided that additional revision be made to specify that the technical standards of main and back-up revenue meters shall adhere to the prevailing standards in the Philippine Grid Code, and that the table of said technical standards, currently in the main body of the manual, be re-located as an Annex to the subject manual

(ii) *Regarding MSP performance rating* – remanded to the RCC and the Market Operator for further study

(iii) *Regarding enhancements to WESM design and operations* – approved for endorsement to the DOE

(iv) *Regarding metering point location* – approved for endorsement to the DOE
Proposed Amendments to the WESM and Retail Rules and Retail Manual on Metering Standards and Procedures for Clarifications on Retail Market Integration – approved for endorsement to the DOE with the caveat that the technical standards in the Retail Rules and Retail Metering Manual that directly referenced the Philippine Distribution Code (PDC) shall only be effective once the latest version of the PDC has been approved.

On the direct referencing of the relevant market manuals to the PDC or the Philippine Grid Code (PGC), Mr. Binondo stated there has been an on-going discussion with the DOE

218 regarding the same since the PDC and PGC are only being reviewed more or less every six
219 (6) years. The concern mainly is that there may be DOE Circulars adopting enhancements to
220 the power system which will not be aligned with the provisions of the PDC or the PGC. He
221 further stated that the DOE will still thoroughly review the submitted amendments and consider
222 these cases.

223 The RCC noted the information.








